- 2 Submit documents to UAA Office of Admissions:
 - Official transcript showing completion and conferral of a baccalaureate degree and any transcripts reflecting graduate level courses
 - Two letters of recommendation
 - Official GMAT scores if applicable. GMAT waivers may be considered for applicants meeting any of the following criteria:
 - ▶ Hold another master's degree from an accredited university
 - ▶ Have a professional designation such as CPM, CPIM, or CTL
 - ▶ Have an undergraduate GPA greater than 3.0
 - TOEFL exam if applicable
