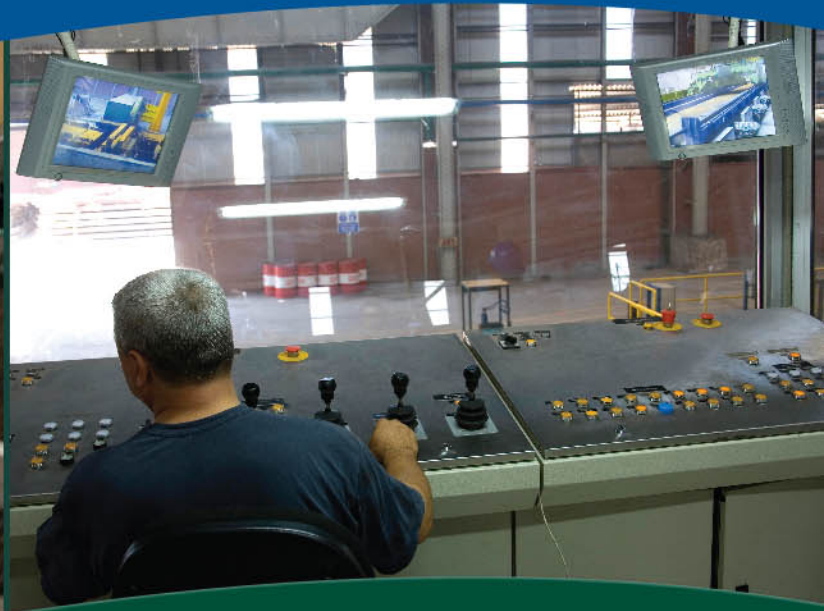


Logistics & Supply Chain Operations (OEC, Cert, AAS)
