



BA A490B ANCSA LAND ALASKA NATIVE BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

The Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) was signed into law by President Nixon in 1971. ANCSA established 12 regional corporations and over 200 village corporations within Alaska and restored 44 million acres of land to Alaska's first people. This unique course explores land as defined by ANCSA and covers some of the unique qualities of this land. The course will cover the history of ANCSA land, contemporary issues related to decisions within this unique area and the authority and obligations with the implementation of ANCSA. The class meets over two consecutive Friday's, from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on November 9 & 16. Late registration is permitted for this course; however, seats are limited.

Who should take this course

This upper division course is offered as a 1-credit elective within the **Alaska Native Business Management** minor at UAA's College of Business and Public Policy. Students in the minor are encouraged to attend.
