If waived, the student will need to select 3 additional upper division credits to total 45. Students are urged to discuss the internship requirement with their advisor early in the semester, **before registering for this course**.

<sup>6</sup> Admission to Upper Division Standing does not waive individual course prerequisites (e.g., course pre-requisites for BA 377 are: BA 273 and MATH 272).

**NOTE:** A total of 120 credits is required for the BBA degree. At least 50% of the business credits required for the BBA degree must be earned at the University of Alaska Anchorage. A minimum of 45 upper division credits is required. **A grade of C or better is required for all ACCT, BA, CIS, ECON & LOG courses.**
