NOTE: A total of 120 credits is required for the BBA degree. At least 50% of the business credits (ACCT, BA, CIS, ECON, LGOP and LOG) required for the BBA degree must be earned at the University of Alaska Anchorage. A minimum of 42 upper division credits is required.

A grade of C or better is required for all major requirements.

BBA ACCOUNTING

Accounting is often referred to as the “language of business,” because it communicates economic information to decision-makers. The BBA in Accounting gives students a broad-based business background and provides a solid foundation for careers in public accounting, private accounting, and accounting for government or non-profit organizations.
