A combination of ECON 201, ECON 202, and BA A151 will fulfill the GER Social Science 6 credit requirement.

The internship is intended to be in <u>logistics</u> and/or <u>supply chain management</u>. This requirement may be waived if the program advisor determines that the student already has significant work experience. If waived, the student will need to select 3 additional business upper-division credits to total 48. Students must discuss the internship requirement with their advisor early in the semester, **before registering for this course.**

⁶ Admission to Upper-Division Standing does not waive individual course prerequisites (e.g., course pre-requisites for BA 377 are: BA 273 and MATH 221/251).

Students are required to complete a minimum of three credits of Alaska Native-Themed GER coursework from the approved GER list. If the course is also categorized as a GER (in a separate category), it can overlap and count for both categories. If this overlap occurs, then for this planning sheet, students will fulfill these 3 credits with an Elective instead (see note 1 above).
