<sup>6</sup> Admission to Upper-Division Standing does not waive individual course prerequisites. See UA Online or the catalog for course prerequisites.

<sup>7</sup> Students must complete three credits of Alaska Native-Themed GER as well as three credits of Diversity & Inclusion GER coursework from the approved GER list. However, the same course cannot meet both the AKN and DI requirements. If overlap occurs with a separate, existing Tier II GER category, then for this planning sheet, students will fulfill these 3 credits with an Elective instead (see note 1 above).

**NOTE:** A total of 120 credits is required for the BBA degree, 48 of which must be upper-division. At least 50% of the business credits (ACCT, BA, CIS, ECON, LGOP and LOG) required for the BBA degree must be earned at the University of Alaska Anchorage. **A grade of C or better is required for all major requirements.**
