This requirement may be waived if the program advisor determines that the student already has significant work experience. If waived, the student will need to select 3 additional business upper-division credits to total 48. Students must discuss the internship requirement with their advisor early in the semester, **before registering for this course**.

<sup>4</sup> Major electives may include courses listed here. In addition **300- or 400-level business courses may be used, but Advisor Approval must be confirmed before the course(s) can be counted toward the degree. Please see your advisor before selecting your 6 credits of upper-division electives. These courses may not be used to fulfill multiple requirements. Students must satisfy course prerequisites before registering.**

<sup>6</sup> Students must complete three credits of Alaska Native-Themed GER as well as three credits of Diversity & Inclusion GER coursework from the approved GER list. However, the same course cannot meet both the AKN and DI requirements. If overlap occurs with a separate, existing Tier II GER category, then for this planning sheet, students will fulfill these 3 credits with an Elective instead (see note 1 above).

**NOTE:** A total of 120 credits is required for the BBA degree, 45 of which must be upper-division. At least 50% of the business credits (ACCT, BA, CIS, ECON, LGOP and LOG) required for the BBA degree must be earned at the University of Alaska Anchorage.

A grade of C or better is required for all major requirements.
